LIVING THE SCRIPTURES STUDENT SYLLABUS

COURSE GOAL:

This course is designed to reexamine Sacred Scriptures and help students explore the Bible to better grow in their relationships with God and then LIVE the Scriptures in the school, parishes, and their lives.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Students will learn about how to better interpret the Bible through various means including looking at the context of the book, who the author was, what time period was it written in, the intended audience etc. Students will be asked to help prepare and lead PA announcement prayers, Morning Prayer services, and liturgies. They will have many practical opportunities in the high school environment to apply what you learn.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

- The course has a flow beginning with answering questions regarding their faith and then moving into their books of the Bible presentations. From here, the class will learn how to better pray with the Bible.
- While this is the flow of the class, the SMCC liturgical calendar will take precedence as we prepare for these liturgies. There will also be extra time spent on approaching liturgical seasons (such as Advent in the Fall and Lent in the Spring).
